CLASS RANK

Students are officially ranked at the end of their sophomore year. Students ranked in the top 6% at the conclusion of their sophomore, junior, or senior year may be eligible for the SC Palmetto Fellows Scholarship based on their cumulative GPA and standardized test scores. COMMUNITY SERVICE

Community service is a key emphasis of our high school program. Seniors must have 60 hours of accumulated community service in order to graduate. WCCS offers local service activities throughout the year for students to earn hours. Hours can also be earned outside of school by volunteering with churches and non-profit organizations. The 47 graduates of the WCCS Class of 2019 accumulated over 5,000 hours of community service during their high school years.

ATHLETICS & FINE ARTS

WCCS students participate in a variety of athletic offerings including baseball, basketball, soccer, cheerleading, clay shooting, cross country, golf, swimming, and volleyball. WCCS is a member of the Metrolina Athletic Conference (MAC) and the North Carolina Independent Schools Athletic Association (NCISAA). Five students from the Class of 2019 were recruited to play sports at the collegiate level in baseball and volleyball. Fine arts offerings include chorus, band, theater, and visual arts. Six students from the Class of 2019 went on to pursue the fine arts.
